# **Admission Requirements**

Osaka YWCA College offers the Japanese Language Course to non-Japanese students who are willing to proceed to school in Japan, such as university (college), graduate school, junior college or vocational school. The students also would be able to prepare for New Examination for International Students in Japan and other tests in required classes (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, English and General Knowledge "Japan and the World").

# **Qualifications:**

- 1. Finished at least 12 years of schooling (equivalent to Japanese high school graduate) overseas or has equivalent qualification.
- 2. Intends to receive higher education such as proceeding to a Japanese university (college) or pass Japanese Language Proficiency Test.
- 3. Clear vision of purpose of studying.
- 4. In good health condition to complete long-term studies.

- April course: By 31st March. October course: 30th Sept. Tuition fees will be returned but entrance fees are no refundable. Should you happen not to obtain visa regardless of your proper preparation, the above may not necessary be the case.

# **Application to Admission**

## 1. Application

The applicant or his/her representative is to submit the necessary forms to the office within the application period in person. Those applying from overseas can send us the forms via Registered Mail (EMS).

### 2. Screening

The first screening is examining your submitted application related forms. You or your representative will be notified of the results within 2 weeks after all your required documents arrived here in YWCA. For second screening, you will be interviewed in Japanese to assess your Japanese ability. You will be notified of the results within 1 week from the interview. Those who were rejected will be returned the submitted certificates (original certificates etc.).

### 3. Application to Immigration Bureau

We will apply to Immigration Bureau on your behalf to obtain Certificate of Eligibility.

### 4. Issuance of Certificate of Eligibility

Once the Immigration Bureau approves your application, "Certificate of Eligibility" will be sent to us (approximately 1 month prior to starting school.). Then we will contact you or your representative to ask you or him/her to complete payment for admission at our office in person. In exchange, you or your representative will receive Certificate of Eligibility and Letter of Admission. We will then give you or your representative a brief orientation on Entrance Ceremony Day and other important days along with ways to remit tuition etc. It is possible to apply for admission to dormitories then.

Those directly applying from abroad will be sent the necessary documents via EMS after confirmation of remittance of Admission fee.

### 5. Obtainment of Student Visa

Applicants are to apply for visa with Letter of Admission, Certificate of Eligibility and passport at diplomatic establishments abroad (Japanese Embassy or Consulate). Certificate of Eligibility is valid for 3 months.

### 6. Admission procedure

Complete payment of tuition prior to Entrance Ceremony Day. Make sure to be in Japan by the appointed date. Should you have difficulty arriving by this time please make sure to contact us.

- Generally, the only submitted documents returned to you by the Immigration Bureau will be original certificates that cannot be reissued. Should you need to be returned of others, please inform us upon application.
- Depending on the condition of the applicant, other documentation may be required in addition to the separate forms "Required forms for the Remitter him/herself" and/or "Required Application of the applicant him/herself".
- If you have proper visa status (i.e. Spouse or Child of Japanese National, Spouse or Child of Permanent Resident, Long-Term Resident), read "Admission Requirements for Domestic Applicants".


